

POLYNESIAN VOYAGING SOCIETY

A non-profit organization formed to commemorate the discovery of Hawaii and to document the knowledge, strength and courage of those who first touched these and the shores of other Polynesian islands. Without maps, charts or instruments, and before European ocean exploration began, the Polynesian peoples explored and settled habitable islands within 15,000,000 square miles of the Earth's largest ocean, a feat which must rank forever as one of man's greatest accomplishments.

The Polynesian Voyaging Society invites your participation to celebrate the beginnings of the historical and maritime achievements of our Hawaiian ancestors, cultural ancestors of us all.

PADDLE AWARDS PROGRAM

In old Polynesia, the building of an important seafaring vessel was a community project toward which everyone proudly contributed what they could. In the same spirit, the Polynesian Voyaging Society presents its objectives as a community project, and asks for your help.

In ancient Hawaii, paddles were given names and certain powers were attributed to them, especially those which had been long used and had been passed down from father to son. To these sea people, the paddle was one of the most highly regarded tools.

After the 1976 voyage to Tahiti and back, the paddle will be one of the most prized mementos of the trip. As a token of appreciation to those individuals, business firms and organizations who make contributions of \$2,000 or more towards the construction of the 60 foot canoe and its return voyage to Tahiti, they will be given one of the paddles used on the voyage after its return to Hawaii. Along with the paddle, the donor will be given a plaque suitably inscribed and ready for placement on a wall. For this canoe voyage, three different types of paddles will be used:

The Paddles

Twenty-four koa paddles 6'5" long with a blade width of 12". The shape conforms to the archaic Polynesian paddle from which the classical Hawaiian oval-shaped blade evolved.

Donors contributing \$2,000 will receive this paddle.

Steering Paddles

Four steering paddles of koa will be used on the voyage while the vessel is sailing into or across the wind, or is being paddled. While under sail, one steering paddle is carried on the leeward side of each hull. In heavy winds, all four paddles may be used.

Donors contributing \$5,000 will receive one of these paddles.

Steering Sweeps

Two steering sweeps, 19' in length, will be used while the vessel is running downwind. In heavy weather as many as four men may be required on each sweep. (The steering paddles cannot be used when running straight downwind because there is insufficient lateral resistance to make them operative.)

Donors contributing \$7,500 will receive one of these paddles.

Other Benefits of the Paddle Awards Program

1. The Official Book of the Hawaii-Tahiti-Hawaii Commemorative Voyage of discovery. To be published by Dodd, Mead & Company, it will be written by Dr. Ben F. Finney and Herbert Kawainui Kane during the year following the voyage. All major donors will be listed in the book and each will receive a specially-bound limited edition copy, autographed by members of the crew.
2. Launching Ceremony. All donors of \$2,000 or more will be invited to the canoe's launching to be held sometime in March, 1975.
3. Celebration Cruise. All major donors will be invited to a celebration sailing on the canoe in Honolulu Harbor scheduled for spring, 1975.
4. Every paddle awards participant will be given a "Makua me Lokomaikai (benefactor) membership in the Polynesian Voyaging Society.
5. The Polynesian Voyaging Society desires to publicize the names of all benefactors in all appropriate publications and other media.

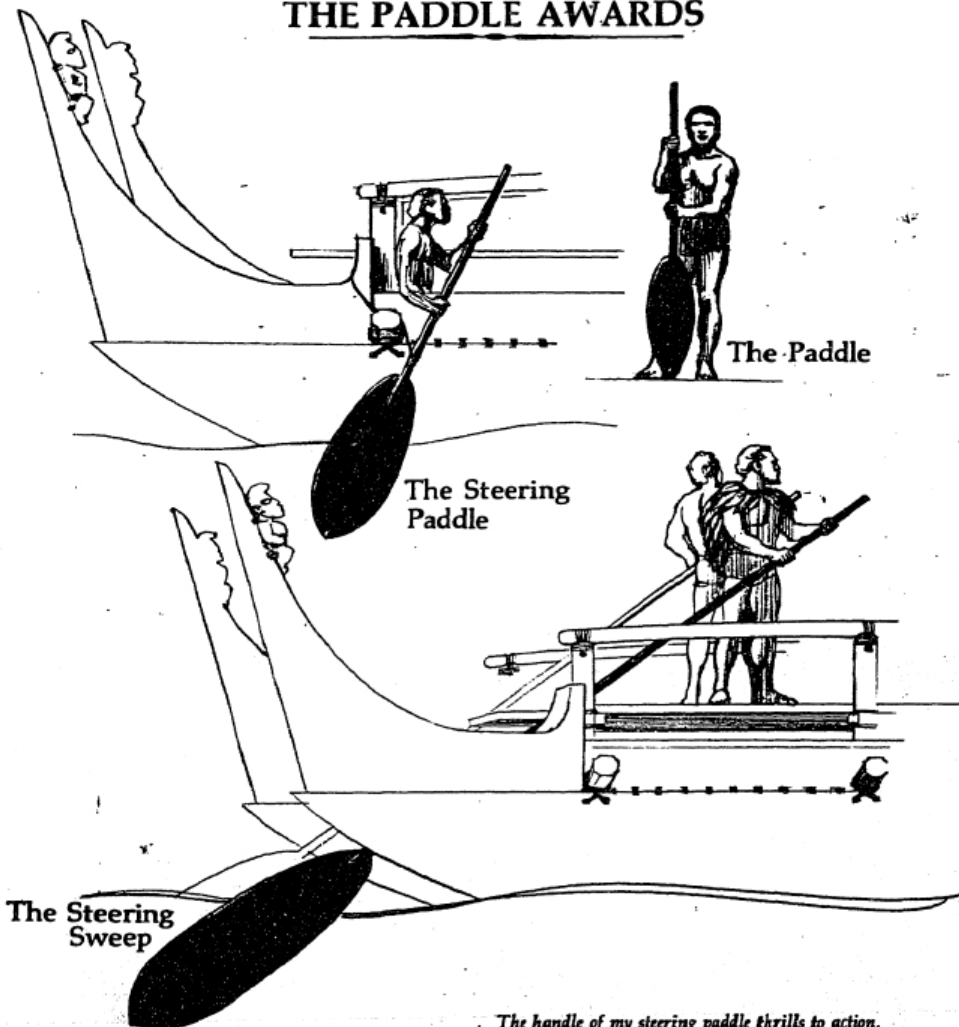

THE PADDLE AWARDS



In ancient Hawaii, paddles were given names and certain powers were attributed to them, especially those which had been long used and had been passed down from father to son. The following Maori chant translated by Sir Peter Buck is expressive of such attitudes:

*The handle of my steering paddle thrills to action,
My paddle named Kautu-ki-te-rangi.
It guides to the horizon but dimly discerned.
To the horizon that lifts before us,
To the horizon that ever recedes,
To the horizon that ever draws near,
To the horizon that causes doubt,
To the horizon that instills dread,
To the horizon with unknown power,
The horizon not hitherto pierced.
The lowering skies above,
The raging seas below,
Oppose the untraced path
Our ship must go.*

In ancient Hawaii, paddles were given names and certain powers were attributed to them, especially those which had been long used and had been passed down from father to son. The following Maori chant translated by Sir Peter Buck is expressive of such attitudes:

*The handle of my steering paddle thrills to action,
My paddle named Kautu-ki-te-rangi.
It guides to the horizon but dimly discerned.
To the horizon that lifts before us,

To the horizon that ever draws near,

Dear Ben:

Enclosed you will find my personal check for \$500 to cover the "purchase" of the remaining 'iako on the canoe being prepared for the voyage next year to Tahiti. This gift may be considered as one from "The Mason Family."

In response to your request for a Hawaiian name for the 'iako I would like to submit

"Hawai'i-loa"

for the following reasons.

First, Peter Buck tells us that "Legend states that Hawai'i was first settled by Hawai'i-loa," when with his navigator Makali'i he sailed far to the east where they came to an island which Hawai'i-loa "named after himself," and that subsequently Hawai'i-loa returned to his home for his family and retinue and sailed back to Hawai'i, "where he became the first settler." This is from Buck's Vikings of the Sunrise, pp. 248-49, and is of course familiar to you.

Second, a more objective commentator, Martha Beckwith, relates the story of Hawai'i-loa as part of the Kumuhonua legend, recounting the peopling of parts of Polynesia, including Hawaii, by the four sons of Aniani-ka-lani, one of whom was Hawai'i-loa. She cites references from Fornander, Kepelino, and Thrum. I understand that there are differences in interpretation of this legendary account, but it seems to me that the name of Hawai'i-loa is firmly established in the oral traditions which attempt to account for the early settlements of Hawaii, as Martha Beckwith puts it, "before migration legends to Hawaii begin to take on the color of actual history." This material I found in Miss Beckwith's Hawaiian Mythology (1970 edition), pages 363-65.

The reason that I decided on Hawai'i-loa as a name for the 'iako has a more personal aspect. As you know, Hawaii Loa College chose that name when it started on its exploration of a new kind of college curriculum. To quote from the College brochure, in answer to why the College was named Hawaii Loa:

"In Hawaiian Folklore, Hawaii Loa was a great Polynesian navigator who discovered Hawaii. The leadership qualities of the first Hawaii Loa -- leading his people forth -- are what Hawaii Loa is endeavoring to accomplish; to bring the future leaders of our State, the Mainland and the Pacific Basin together to share and prepare as leaders of the people. "Loa" in itself means "massive" or "thrusting forward," suggesting the continual search for truth and moving ahead."


From its planning stage, I have been interested in Hawaii Loa College, and have contributed in various ways, in the years since, to its development of the themes expressed above. I believe the Voyaging Project has been conceived in the same spirit. Hence the name, "Hawai'i-loa" makes sense to me as a proper name for one of the canoe's 'iako. I hope you and your colleagues will find it acceptable as well.

DOCUMENTS CAPTURED AS RECEIVED

I have talked with Hawaii Loa College's president, Chandler Rowe, himself an anthropologist, as you may know. He is pleased to have the school's name interpreted in the context of my contribution to the Polynesian Voyaging Society. I will send him a note on the matter, for the record, once I hear from you that the name I have submitted is agreeable to your group.

It is a pleasure to be a part of the Voyaging project in this way, and came about through the rather intensive exposure I've had the past month to the details of the project as described in the four Neighbor Island workshops (actually one was on Oahu) sponsored by Pacific and Asian Affairs Council and the Pacific Islands Studies Program at the University. My participation in the workshops was made possible by my temporary association with the Pacific Islands Program this spring semester.

Ben Finney reported on the Polynesian Voyaging Society's double canoe which is being built at Pier 41. It is an artifact which must be created because there is none in existence, so it is not "preservation" in a strict sense. The 60 foot canoe has a greater potential for teaching, however, than 40 foot canoes which are already under sail. Dr. Finney invited Committee members to the launching set for Saturday, March 8, near the Waikiki Natatorium.

IV Other Business

The Projects Subcommittee recommended approval for the request of \$500 for an iako (crossbeam) to the Polynesian Voyaging Society.

*** Following discussion and a thorough study, a motion was made to accept the recommendation and to raise the amount \$500 to \$1000 (one thousand dollars) for the purchase of two iako's. The Motion was carried unanimously.

Committee members felt that this canoe's usefulness is of cultural, scientific, and educational value. Its support by the community and participation in the state's Bicentennial celebration warrants firm support by this Committee.

Abe Pi'ianaia will prepare a covering letter on behalf of our Committee to emphasize the Committee's sincere interest in the project.



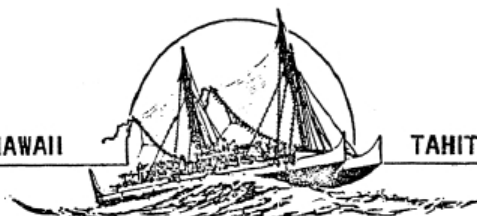

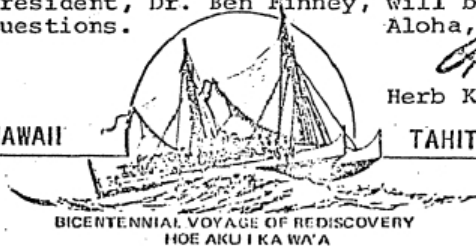
