#### PRESIDENT'S SPEECH

Michael, the following is a brief outline of items that I feel should be covered in your speech.

- A. Welcome and thank members and guests for being at the meeting, and most importantly for their past and continued support. It is because of the members and their support that Hokule'a and the Society are now part of history.
- B. Review the purpose of the Polynesian Voyaging Society:

The Polynesian Voyaging Society is a unique group dedicated to education and research into the lifestyle of seafaring Polynesians who traveled on their voyaging canoes and inhabited the hundreds of islands in the Pacific. The Society is interested in the arts, artifacts, food, plants, and animals that made the first Polynesian discovery and settlement of the Hawaiian Islands possible. Primary objectives is to do fact finding and share this information with others.
- C. Go over the goals and objectives of the Polynesian Voyaging Society. ( That would come from your memo.) (See attached.)
- D. Events during the year 1977-1978:
  - 1. On March 16, 1978, Hokule'a Elua swamped and did not complete her second attempt to sail to Tahiti. Also there was the loss of Eddie Aikau. Hokule'a was taken to Keehi Drydock for major repairs and on July 12, 1978, she reentered the water and was motored over to Pier 12. She will remain at Pier 12, until additional finances are received to completely refurbish her for ocean voyages.
  - 2. We have received the official Coast Guard Report. Review what the Society plans to do in accordance with the Report:
    - a. She will sail again:
      - When completely refurbished
      - Comply with all Coast Guard safety requirements and regulations
      - Her crew given complete training on Polynesian voyaging.
  - 3. Thru Alu Like and CETA the Society has seven employees: Administrative Secretary, Education Coordinator, Vessel Supervisor, Vessel Navigator, and three seapersons.
- E. Refurbishing of Hokule'a:
  - 1. Introduce Wally Froiseth, Chairperson for the Canoe Committee responsible for the repairs, and Leon Sterling, Vessel Supervisor.
  - 2. Go over what has been done to Hokule'a and what needs to

2. be done to Hokule'a.
3. On December 2 and 3, Saturday and Sunday, need volunteers at Pier 12 to work on Hokule'a. Be there at 8:00 A.M.

F. Accomplishments of the Polynesian Voyaging Society

1. In 1976, Hokule'a sailed to Tahiti and back. A 3,000 mile journey to Tahiti without compass or any other instrument. Hokule'a proved herself seaworthy.
2. In April 1977, Hokule'a also sailed on the Kealaikahiki Channel and proved the validity of the ancient route to Tahiti. Also proved that Hokule'a is a well designed sailing canoe capable of sailing on a proposed track to gain the necessary "easting" needed to complete a long voyage from Hawai'i to Tahiti. Also it proved that sailing on this track, it proved a more stable and comfortable platform for a crew departing on a long voyage.
3. The Children's Book Project, a series of four children's book and Resource Curriculum Guide based on the oral traditions of High Chief Mo'ikeha and his family are currently being used in over 160 schools throughout the United States and British Columbia.
4. The Education Committee under the guidance of Cecilia Lindo, are now in the process of editing their new book Na Hana Huakai, or the Voyaging Works which will include background material on navigation, foods, plants, animals, constellations, currents, winds, chants, genealogy and all aspects of Polynesian voyaging.
5. In the beginning of 1977, Hokule'a was used as a teaching aid, or floating classroom and visited Oahu, Kauai, Lanai, Molokai and Hawaii. Over 17,000 children and adults have had the opportunity of hearing about Hokule'a through the Speaker's Bureau.

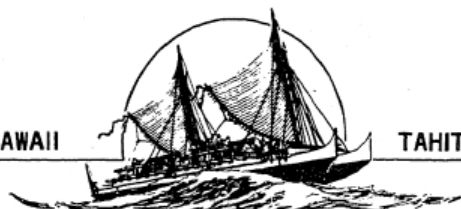

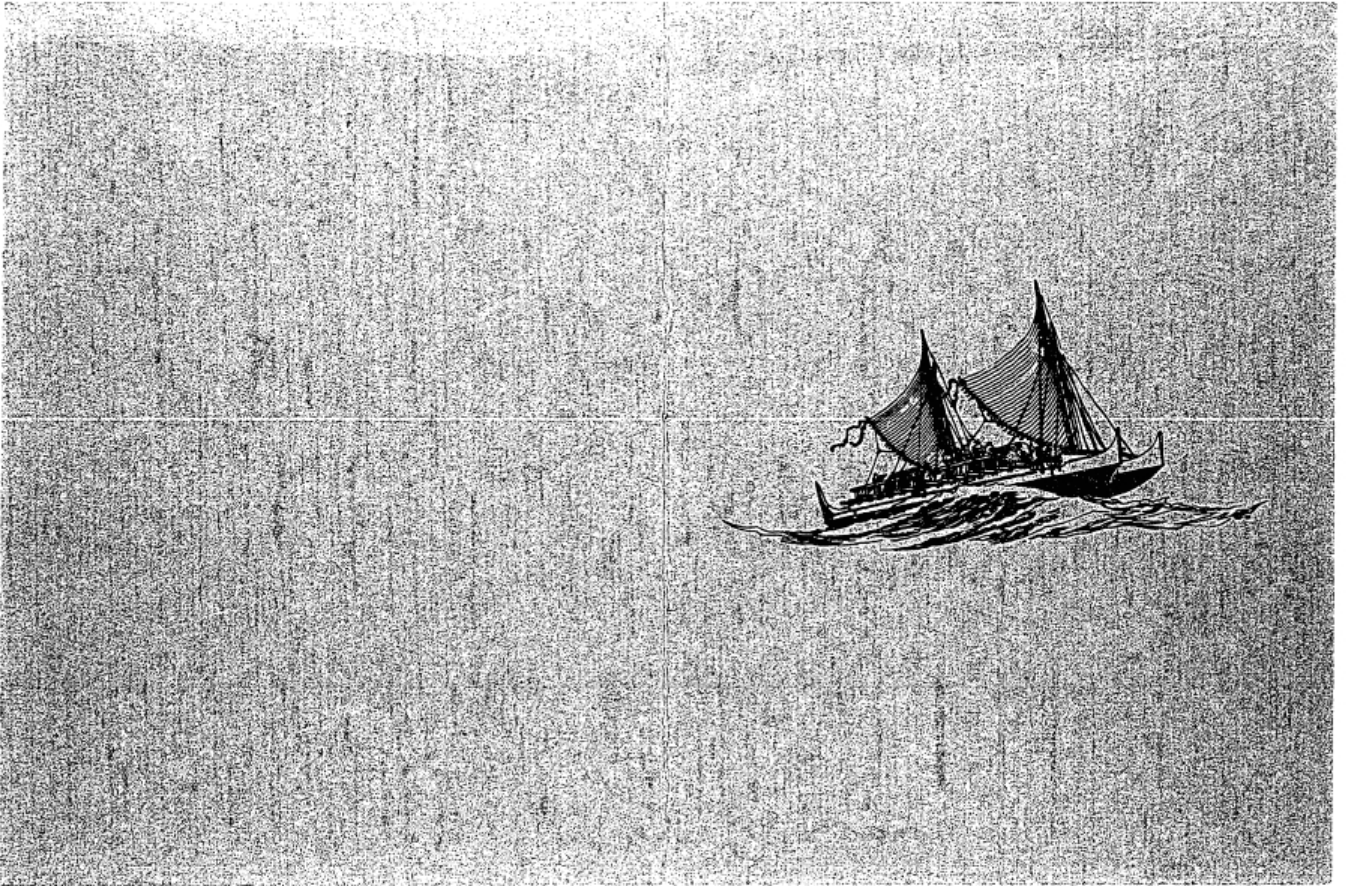
