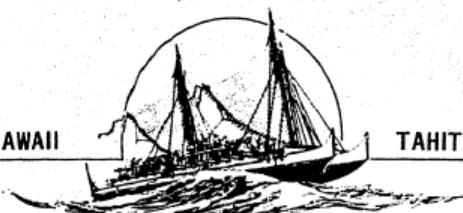

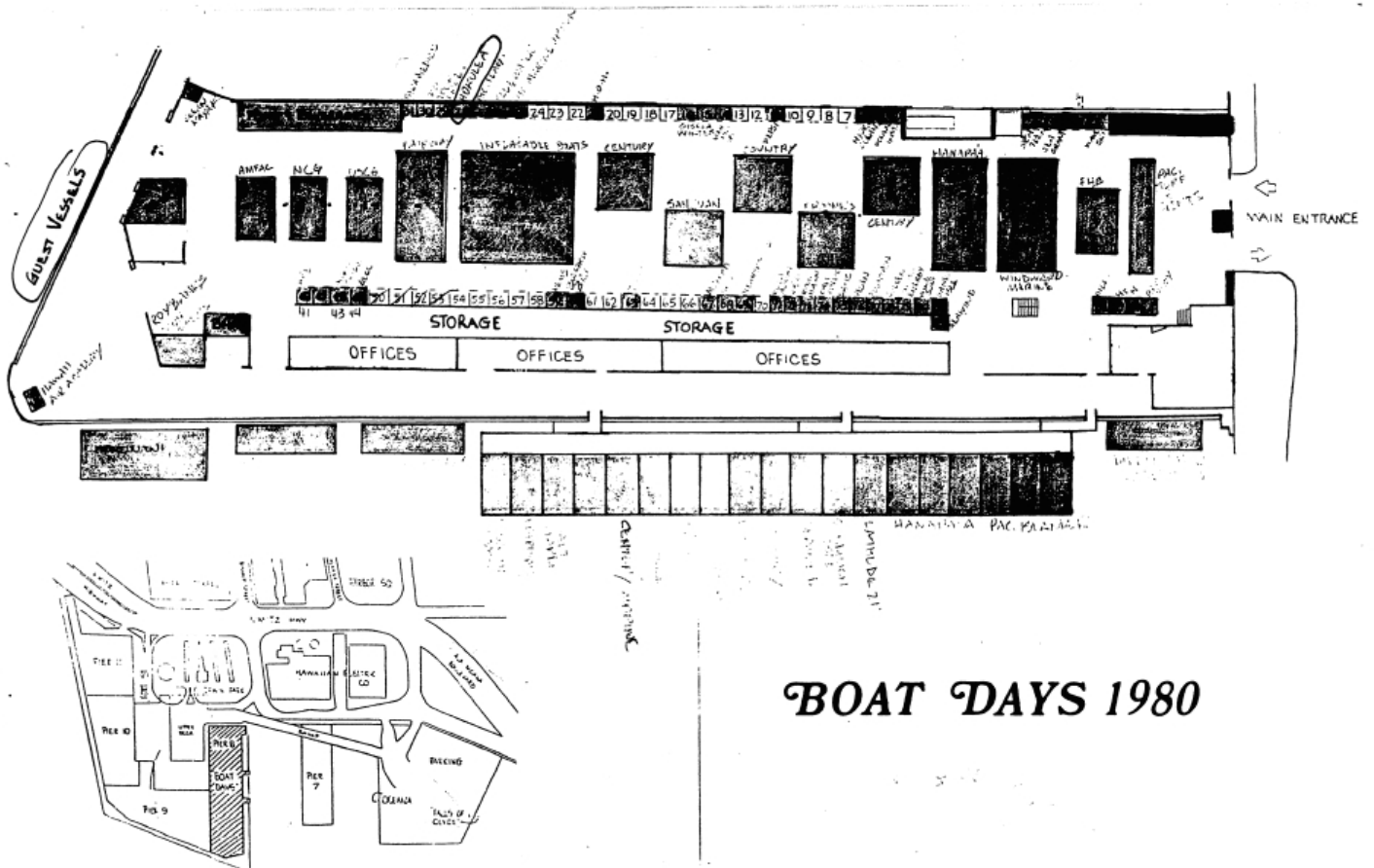

Sailing Smoothly

With slip spaces SOLD OUT and bulk space nearly filled, BOAT DAYS 1980 promises to make a spectacular debut on November 20th. All the major boat dealers in Honolulu are now signed up in the show, along with several from the Mainland. And there's lots of support from smaller, marine-related enterprises.

The other good news is that our marketing team and other sources are reporting a buzz of excitement among those in the industry and Boat Days is still a month away! We've got a local publication lined up to do a cover story on the show and several radio and television stations are interested in doing interviews and other promotional coverage on this first-time event. And it won't be hard to

spark the interest of the media. Sports Enterprises (Fred Hemmings, Inc.) is organizing a number of special events like jet ski demonstrations and water ski exhibitions in the Harbor. Plus Boat Days has invited a number of "guest" vessels to tie up at Pier 9 which will also attract wide public interest. The Navy's retired submarine, U.S.S. Bowfin, the Hokule'a and a Coast Guard vessel have already confirmed their participation.

Boat Days participated in the Aloha Tower Festival on October 19th which celebrated the "Year of the Coast." There was a good turnout at the event and we snatched up the opportunity to alert the public that a great new boat show was coming soon.

So, from all angles, Boat Days 1980 is looking good, and we're excited!

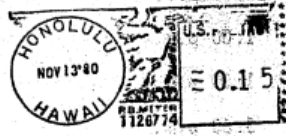
