

DOCUMENTS CAPTURED AS RECEIVED

If your dependents do not have SSNs, application may be made at the nearest Social Security office by filing **Form SS-5**, Application for a Social Security Number Card. A birth certificate or other birth record and proof of identity will need to be presented for each new applicant at the time of application. For those born outside the U.S., proof of citizenship or lawful alien status is also required. If your dependents currently have SSNs, you should **not** contact the Social Security Administration.

If you live outside the U.S., contact the nearest Social Security office, U.S. Embassy, or consulate. U.S. military personnel abroad should contact the Family Service Center at the post where they are stationed.

Important Notice

Have You Completed the 1987 Form W-4 or Form W-4A Withholding Certificate?

If you are an employee and have not given your employer a 1987 Form W-4 or W-4A, please do it as soon as possible so the right amount of tax can be withheld from your pay. The law requires you to file the 1987 Form W-4 or W-4A with your employer before October 1, 1987, but you should not wait that long. Get either form from your employer. **Important point:** *If you have already given your employer a 1987 Form W-4 or W-4A, you do not have to do it again unless you want to make a change.*

If you have filed either 1987 form and received at least one paycheck showing your new withholding, you may want to get Publication 919, "Is My Withholding Correct?" It will help you check to see that the right amount of tax is being withheld for 1987. You can get Publication 919 by calling toll free 1-800-424-3676.

Social Security Numbers for Dependents

Beginning with your 1987 Federal income tax return that you will file in 1988, you must list the Social Security Numbers (SSNs) of all dependents you claim who are age 5 or over.

The Polynesian Voyaging Society is pleased to inform you that we have speakers, video tapes, 16 mm films and slide shows which are available to organizations such as yours, and which deal with ~~many aspects of~~ ancient Polynesian navigation and the settlement of the "Polynesian Triangle" -- 14 million square miles of the Pacific Ocean that includes Hawai'i.

Our double-hulled sailing canoe Hōkūle'a is a performance-accurate replica of vessels which carried Polynesians over vast reaches of trackless ocean centuries before Europeans on the other side of the world dared to venture out of sight of land.

Hōkūle'a sails for the most part without the aid of modern instruments, after the manner of ~~the~~ early Polynesian navigators. Presently, the canoe is on a "Voyage of Rediscovery" which is taking it farther into the Pacific than ever before: to Tahiti, the Cook Islands, New Zealand, Sāmoa, Tonga, and eventually home to Hawai'i -- a trip spanning the years 1985-1987. ^{Never before} ~~This is the first time~~ in history ^{has} ~~that~~ such a project ~~has~~ been undertaken.

Besides writing to say "hello", you have been requested to speak at the Pearl Harbor Rotary Club. They have given me several dates for you to choose from:






