The Polynesian Voyaging Society has produced and published a series of illustrated books relating to sea voyaging, which is central to an understanding of Hawaiian culture.

The first three books in the series retell an ancient legend about a voyage between Hawaii and Tahiti. The fourth book tells about Hokule'a, and the goals and dreams of the Polynesian Voyaging Society. A resource curriculum guide is available to aid teachers in using the books in the classroom.

These books are well authenticated and touch upon many aspects of Hawaiian culture. They can be used as the core of a Hawaiiana curriculum and used in the fourth and seventh grades.


A set of books sell for \$6.24 (includes tax) and the Teacher's Guide is \$2.60 (includes tax).
